

LONDON: A Catholic homeless charity, Caritas Anchor House (CAH), has been awarded £299,960 to support homeless people into education and employment. CAH is one of many projects across the country to benefit from The Big Lottery Fund's Reaching Communities programme, to support communities most in need to give people better chances. By funding the salaries of two key posts – an e-learning co-ordinator and programme manager – CAH can develop their services to support homeless and vulnerable people into employment and education in Newham, East London. The charity provides a home to more than 230 homeless people each year, and records 17,000 visits from members of the community accessing their services.
