Hannah Krone is taking to the streets of London to support those who are forced to live on them.

The 23-year-old, of City Road, is joining 38,000 others at the London Marathon to raise money for Caritas [Anchor House](#).

The charity is based in Canning Town, east London, and supports more than 210 homeless people in and around the borough of Newham each year. She said: "I hold a long-stand-

ing interest in causes supporting homeless people, and while living in the US I was involved in raising awareness of homelessness.

"So when I found out that Caritas [Anchor House](#) had places available in the London Marathon I was keen to sign up."

Hannah has been training since December and is aiming to finish the marathon in four hours and 50 minutes.

She added: "Though it's been hard work, it will all be worth it in the end.

"I've done previous running

events in the US and elsewhere in Europe, but this is my first time running the London Marathon.

"I'm looking forward to taking part and helping to make a difference to the lives of homeless people."

Hannah has set herself the challenge of raising £2,000 for the charity.

So far, she has secured £655 of sponsorship.
